



Come Hungry to These 11 Happy Hours in Dallas–Fort Worth

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Happy hour gives us something to look forward to at the end of a tough day or week. It's a recurring celebration with friends that just happens to benefit further from cheap drinks and a lively atmosphere. Often, the excitement ends at the bottom of a complimentary bowl of peanuts or maybe some inexpensive edamame. But happy hour is also one of the best-kept secrets for those who like to sample signature dishes at deep discounts at some of the city's most popular restaurants and bars. Here are 11 great happy hours for budget bites in Dallas–Fort Worth.



Blue Sushi Sake Grill

At either the Fort Worth or Dallas locations of this modern sushi restaurant, the happy-hour offerings are plentiful.

Food specials: HH prices start at \$3.50 and nothing's more than \$9.50. That means chowing down on lump crab cakes (\$7), ceviche (\$7), Sapporo-steamed mussels (\$8) and chicken lettuce wraps (\$9.50). More than a dozen maki rolls (pictured above) are just \$5.50 each, while specialty nigiri options clock in at \$4.50 and specialty sashimi tops out at \$9.50.

Drink specials: \$2 sake; \$3.50 sake bombs, house margaritas and draft beers; \$4.50 house wines; and \$6.50 signature martinis. (Drink specials not offered during late-night happy hour Friday and Saturday.)
